## March's Events

- Oregon Mobile Integrated Healthcare Meeting – State organization that seeks to improve processes and funding for MIH in the State of Oregon.
- CPR AED Class at First Lutheran Church – Two volunteers gave their time to offer an introductory class to members of the Lutheran Church.
- Awards Banquet – I had the opportunity to attend and present a few awards at the annual association banquet.
- Quality Management Process with Dallas – Dallas is designing a quality management process that mimics the PCFD process. We provided them with some feedback. We will eventually be able to share data for the purposes of benchmarking.
- AED Distribution Event – Engineer/Paramedic Dalrymple distributed the AEDs purchased by the Spirit Mountain Community Fund grant to agency leaders who participated.
- OFCA EMS Section Meeting – This group meets quarterly to discuss and interact with Oregon Health Authority on those topics that impact EMS systems and delivery.
- Polk County Behavioral Health Intercept Meeting – PCBH is tasked by the state to create a sequential intercept model for those suffering from behavioral health emergencies. The model must include input from EMS partners throughout the county.
- EMS Training Meeting – I met with Deputy Chief Rogers and Division Chief Storms at Dallas Fire & EMS. We are developing a regional training calendar. The shared calendar will significantly reduce the cost of mandatory and preferred certification classes.
- Talmadge Road Cleanup – I had the opportunity to spend time working with District members to keep Talmadge Road clean in honor of Captain Kistler.
- EMS Committee – This group is comprised of line staff and Dr. Lucas. We meet bi-monthly to make tactical decisions that impact our service delivery. This group also serves as PCFD's EMS Quality Management group.
- NFA EMS Quality Management Class– I attended two days of this National Fire Academy class that is being hosted in Eugene and taught over three months. The class instructor built the curriculum for the NFA.
- EMS Drill – Taser Awareness and Probe Removal Training with Monmouth and Independence PD. FF/EMT Allison Wells taught on bleeding control and trauma.

## Apparatus Updates

- BR91 – A water hose was replaced. Annual service performed in preparation of wildland season.
- M474 – A few items were fixed and handles for patient compartment door were replaced.
- D91 – The windshield wiper transmission fixed. The front brakes were replaced.
- C90 – Routine maintenance was performed.
- Studs were removed from ambulances and staff vehicles.
